Session D: Developing Vocal Resonance

Resonance in the voice is produced above the level of the larynx in the vocal tract, which comprises the pharynx and oral cavity. Elongating this cavity makes tone richer and warmer, while shortening the vocal tract makes tone brighter and thinner. Choral directors can strive for a variety of tone colors to match the genre of music being sung. Learn and practice techniques that will shape the vocal tract in developing various resonances.

Session F: The ACDA Student Chapter: Creating, Building and Maintaining a Lifelong Relationship with Choral Music

In "Soaking in *Solfa*," we will investigate a multi-faceted approach of incorporating *solfa* into a choir rehearsal with the goal of developing musical literacy and promoting excellent intonation. First we will discuss the big picture of creating a Kodaly-based *solfa* curriculum for 1st – 8th graders. Second we will look at ways in which *solfa* can continue to be used at a more advanced, high school level rehearsal. Choristers from Pittsburgh Girls Choir will participate in a mini-rehearsal in which *solfa* is used as the foundation for learning a movement from Britten's *Ceremony of Carols*.
